The Stock Market Game™ is a national program of the Foundation for Investor Education and is offered in Kentucky by the Kentucky Council on Economic Education (KCEE). It is an interactive, interdisciplinary program for students in grades 4-12 (and college) to learn about economics, finance, and our American economic system. The program is offered each Fall and Spring. Over a period of 15 weeks, teams of students research companies, make investment decisions, and create their portfolios, investing \$100,000 in imaginary money in stocks and

mutual funds. Teams are ranked on equity in portfolio. Teachers are provided with educational resources to teach students about investing, capital formation, the stock market, and the economy. Student teams compete against other Kentucky teams statewide and across local regions for prizes.

For Fall 2008, 430 teams of 1,499 students and 53 teachers participated in our Fall Stock Market Game competition. A total of 1,082 teams of 4,056 students and 129 teachers took part in our online competitions, either the Take Stock in Kentucky, Fall Stock Market Game, or our new Year-Long Stock Market Game.

Winning teams held a diversified selection of stocks and you can see that teams had various strategies based on the variety of profitable stocks in their portfolios: UltraShort Real Estate ProShares (SRS), Alleghany Corp. (Y) Yahoo! Inc. (YHOO) Best Buy Co. Inc. (BBY) Google Inc. (GOOG) Hershey Co. (HSY) and Delta Air Lines Inc. (DAL).

Students invested during these difficult economic times and most of the winning teams still made a profit, with 18 teams showing a profit with their \$100,000 beginning portfolios. And 88% of the teams participating finished with portfolios that had greater percentage returns in the 15 weeks than the S&P500 for the same period, which shows these students really do their homework when it comes to research! Congratulations to all the teams participating!!

Stock Market Game awards include: 1st place prize of \$300, 2nd place of \$200, and 3rd place of \$100 to be used by the school, class, or team, plus \$50 for a class pizza party. The first place state awards team from Central High School in Jefferson County will receive class trophies and medals at the KCEE Awards luncheon in May, 2009. The top 10 teams in the state will all receive Stock Market Game Winners Tshirts. The top team in each region will also receive a check for \$50 for the team or class.
