Take Stock in Kentucky is our own "Kentucky version" of The Stock Market Game[™] which gives students the opportunity to learn about and invest in businesses with headquarters, subsidiaries, offices and/or plants in Kentucky as well as companies important to the local economy. Using the Stock Market Game[™] program, a national program of the Foundation for Investor Education with an investment simulation, students also learn about economics, finance, and our American economic system. Teachers are provided with educational resources to teach students about investing, capital formation, the stock market, and the economy. The program is offered each Fall and Spring.

In Take Stock in Kentucky, teams of students research local companies, make investment decisions, and create their portfolios, investing \$100,000 in imaginary money in stocks over a 10 week period. Teams are ranked on equity in portfolio. Student teams compete against other Kentucky teams statewide and across local regions for prizes. For Spring 2007, 506 teams of 2,082 students and 67 teachers participated in Take Stock in Kentucky. Additionally, 725 teams of 2,894 students and 99 teachers took part in our Stock Market Game program.

Winning portfolios made their greatest gains in stocks like United State Steel (X); USEC (USU) Industrial Services of America (IDSA); Gray Communication (GTN), Exxon Mobil (XOM; and Siemens (SI). The first place portfolio performed better than the S&P Index by 11.86% during the 10 weeks the team invested.

Take Stock in Kentucky awards include: 1st place prize of \$300, 2nd place of \$200, and 3rd place of \$100 to be used by the school, class, or team, plus \$50 for a class pizza party. The first place state awards team will receive class trophies and medals at the Kentucky Council on Economic Education Recognition Luncheon on May 17, 2007 at the Kentucky Derby Museum in Louisville. The top 10 teams in the state will all receive **"I Took Stock in Kentucky...and Won!** Tshirts. The top team in each region will also receive a check for \$50 for the team or class.
